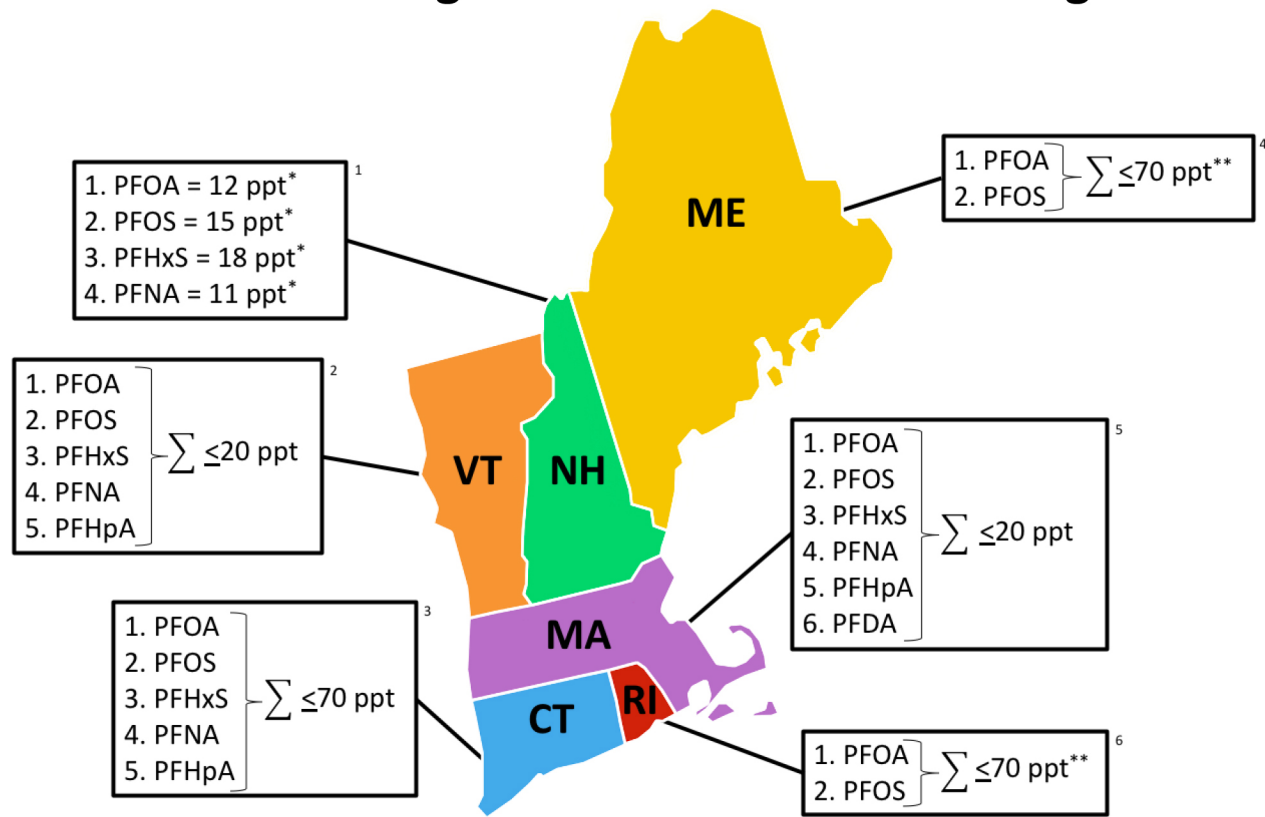


# PFAS Drinking Water Standards – New England



ppt = parts per trillion

$\sum$ : Means the cumulative sum of the individual PFAS levels should not exceed the listed standard in drinking water.

\*Denotes the state has proposed these standards; they are currently not enforceable.

\*\*Denotes the state has adopted EPA's established PFAS health advisory levels.
