

## Harvard-wide Pediatric Health Services Research Fellowship Program

## <u>Goals</u>

- Address critical gaps in child health services research, including studies of access, quality, outcomes, and cost-effectiveness of care
- Fundamentally improve the capacity of the U.S. health care system to meet the needs of children and families, including disadvantaged and minority populations and children with chronic health conditions
- Training in comparative effectiveness research, to maximize patient outcomes by testing alternative treatments, strategies and policies in real world settings.
- Training in implementation and improvement science

<u>Learning Opportunities</u> -Two-year program includes intensive mentorship; MPH in Clinical Effectiveness at Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health; structured seminars weekly; collaboration opportunities at the Institute for Healthcare Improvement; 80-90% research, 10-20% clinical.

<u>Funding</u> – Institutional NRSA from AHRQ provides a stipend, approximately 50% tuition coverage, small allowance for training related expenses and travel.

<u>Eligibility</u> - Outstanding generalists and subspecialists in pediatrics, postdoctoral clinicians and scientists in related fields; must be U.S. citizen or permanent resident; women and minority candidates are encouraged to apply.
